Fiscal Year 2007/08 Annual Report

Dear Long Cove Member,

John Wooden, UCLA's legendary basketball coach, once reminded his team following a particularly frenetic and sloppy practice, "*Never mistake activity for achievement.*"

During the fiscal year, which ended June 30, 2008, your Endowment Fund proved the exception to Coach Wooden's observation: the year saw considerable activity and a number of accompanying achievements. Most noteworthy, we changed our accounting period from a calendar year to the July 1 - June 30 fiscal year of the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry (CFL), a conversion which greatly simplifies our accounting procedures. This change required a thorough review of all gifts and expenses made or charged to the Fund since its inception. It was a valuable exercise that underscored the exceptional success the Fund has experienced during its brief five-year history which began in August, 2003:

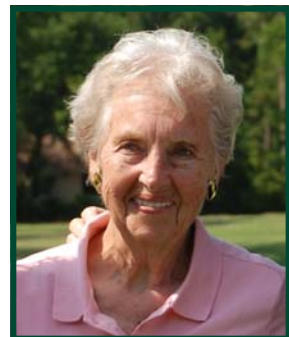
- The endowment portion of the Fund stands at **\$196,406**
- The Endowment Fund has grown just over **32** times its original amount from inception
- The total amount of money for disbursement to charities to date amounts to **\$198,723** (including \$56,625 which was disbursed September 16, 2008 at the Grant Awards Ceremony plus \$14,633 for later disbursement)
- The Fund's overhead costs, which include the CFL's administrative fee of 1%, represent only **2.8%** of donations

It was your continuing generosity that produced the year's most impressive highlight: we awarded **\$48,385** in grants in September 2007, an amount that topped the previous year's total by just over **\$22,000**. Additionally, another **\$1,000** was designated by Joyce Stroner, Sharon Walters and Denis & Lynn Gagnon, winners of the "Bridge for Charity" and **\$2,500** by the Harters, Manhartsbergers, Shaners, Son-Hings, and Trauts, the 2007 Neighborhood Tour homeowners. The need for these monies has never been greater. Seventeen local charities applied for grants and your Endowment Committee selected twelve of these deserving organizations for your support.

In the final analysis, it was the awarding of these grants last September that represents both the year's most meaningful activity and its most significant achievement. The Grant Awards Ceremony offers the best time and place to see and hear just how much your philanthropy benefits the lives of so many throughout Beaufort and Jasper Counties.

To develop an initiative that will educate school teachers (public and private), school administrators, and daycare providers in the prevention of child sexual abuse.

Received \$1,000

To design a memory book and honorarium cards for critically ill newborns. Julie's Mission supplies volunteers with materials to make handcrafted items for these special little babies.

Received \$2,800

To produce brochures as well as CDs and DVDs in order to promote the preservation of the physical and cultural worlds and the oral traditions of HHI's native people. Profits from these will go toward the continued construction of the Gullah Museum and additional educational materials.

Received \$6,000

To initiate a program called "Brain Boosters." Brain Boosters targets those who are in the early stages of memory loss, and the activities provided help promote an individual's long-term quality of life.
